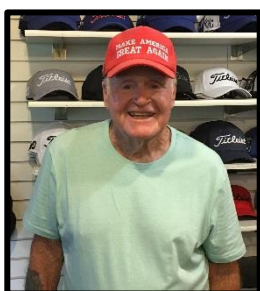
The Official News Letter of the Sunflower Hills Patrons Club

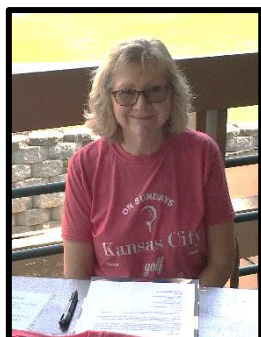

If they are over 20 seconds let them know and encourage them to be ready to play within the 20 second time frame. Also, try to avoid fivesomes. Even the fastest players at Sunflower take two hours to play nine holes when they are in a fivesome.

Upcoming Patron Club Events:

Club Championship

Saturday July 6th

Entry fee for this event is \$25.00 plus green and cart fees. Entry fee includes prizes and dinner with beverages following Saturdays round. The Club Championship will be flighted. The number of entries will determine the number of flights and the breakdown between flights will be determined using USGA handicaps. Prizes will be awarded for individual winners in each flight. The winner of each flight will have the option of receiving a trophy, plaque or an additional \$20 credit. Entrants can play with their regular group. Closest to pin and long drive prizes will be awarded. **Tee times will be assigned for this event**; any Patron that wishes to participate must sign up by Wednesday July 3rd.



43rd Annual Wyandotte County Open

Saturday & Sunday August 10th & 11th

Entry fee for this event is \$90.00, which includes three rounds of golf (qualifying round and two days of tournament play), prizes and dinner with beverages after Sunday's round. This is the 42nd Annual Wyandotte County Open, the longest running event of its kind in the greater Kansas City area. This event is open to all area golfers.

- Limited to the first 120 paid entries.
- Proximity prizes both Saturday & Sunday

Flights will be determined by qualifying rounds (qualifying begins July 6th), or participants may declare Championship or "A" Flights. Deadline on entries is Wednesday, August 7th.

The "Sunflower Sue" 9 Hole Couples Scramble

Friday August 16th

Entry fee for this event is \$60 per couple. Entry includes green & cart fees, range balls, prizes, proximity contests & dinner & beverages following play. This event is a 6:00pm Shotgun Start. Bring a couple to make a foursome or we can pair you up with another couple. Deadline on entries is Thursday, August 15th.

Format: Each player tees off, the best tee shot is selected and both players play their second shots from that spot. The best second shot is determined, and then all play their third shots from that spot, and so on until the ball is holed. Must use at least one shot per player (other than putts) per hole.

**If You're Not Playing By The Rules...
You're Not Playing Golf!**

New Rule: Under Rule 13.1d: There is no longer a penalty if a player (or opponent) accidentally causes the player's ball to move on the putting green.

Reasons for Change:

The shape, slope and condition of many putting greens today increase the chances that a ball at rest on the putting green might move, and it can be difficult to determine whether a player caused the ball to move or whether the ball was moved by wind or other natural causes.

When a ball moves while the player is doing nothing more than taking normal actions to prepare for a stroke, it can seem unfair for the player to be penalized. Most "ball moved" situations occur on the putting green, involve minimal movement of the ball, frequently occur when the player is taking reasonable actions to prepare for a stroke and the ball can be easily replaced.

These considerations are not the same when the ball lies off the putting green, and so the penalty continues to apply (with exceptions, such as accidentally moving a ball during search) to a player or opponent in those circumstances to reinforce the principle that the ball should be played as it lies and that players should continue to exercise care when near to a ball in play.
