Upcoming Patron Club Events:

43rd Annual Wyandotte County Open

Saturday & Sunday August 10th & 11th

Entry fee for this event is \$90.00, which includes three rounds of golf (qualifying round and two days of tournament play), prizes and dinner with beverages after Sunday's round. This is the 43rd Annual Wyandotte County Open, the longest running event of its kind in the greater Kansas City area. This event is open to all area golfers.

- Six (6) men's flights and two (2) women's flights.
- 7:30am Shotgun Starts both Saturday & Sunday.
- Limited to the first 120 paid entries.
- Proximity prizes both Saturday & Sunday
- Lunch on Saturday, featuring hotdogs sponsored by Farmland Foods.
- Dinner following Sunday's round.
- Tee Package Sponsored by Danny's Bar & Grill.

Flights will be determined by qualifying rounds (qualifying began July 6th), or participants may declare Championship or "A" Flights. Deadline on entries is Wednesday, August 7th.

The "Sunflower Sue" 9 Hole Couples Scramble

Friday August 16th

Entry fee for this event is \$60 per couple. Entry includes green & cart fees, range balls, prizes, proximity contests & dinner & beverages following play. This event is a 6:00pm Shotgun Start. Bring a couple to make a foursome or we can pair you up with another couple. Deadline on entries is Thursday, August 15th.



Format: Each player tees off, the best tee shot is selected and both players play their second shots from that spot. The best second shot is determined, and then all play their third shots from that spot, and so on until the ball is holed. Must use at least one shot per player (other than putts) per hole.

Two Man Tri-Play Saturday September 14th

Entry fee for this event is \$20.00 and includes prizes and dinner with beverages following the round. Teams play six holes Scramble, six holes Best Ball and six holes Chapman Alternate Shot. This is one of the most "interesting" events of the year. There will be both Gross and Net overall winners as well as winners for each six hole event. Tee times will be assigned for this event; any Sunflower Hills Patron who wishes to participate must sign up no later than Wednesday, September 11th.

Kansas Red, White & Blue

Saturday October 5th

If You're Not Playing By The Rules... You're Not Playing Golf!

Major Rule Change: Replacing Ball When Original Spot is Not Known

New Rule: Under Rule 14.2c:

- The ball is always placed on a spot rather than dropped.
- If the exact original spot is not known, the player is required to replace the ball on its estimated spot (including on, under or against any attached natural objects that the ball had been at rest on, under or against).

Reasons for Change:

A fundamental principle of golf is to play the ball as it lies; so this should mean that, when a ball at rest is moved, it should be returned to and played from its original spot or as close to that original spot as possible.

When a player marks the ball's spot with a ball-marker before lifting the ball, the original spot is known and the ball is replaced on the marked spot.

But when a ball is accidentally moved, the player may not know the exact original spot:

- Previously, if the ball had been at rest anywhere off the putting green, the player had to drop the ball as near as possible to its estimated spot and play the ball from where it came to rest (unless it rolls to where it must be re-dropped under Rule 20-2c).
- This meant that the ball was often not played from the estimated spot, as the dropped ball



- was allowed to roll as much as two-club lengths away from that spot.
- It also meant that the ball may have ended up being played from a better or worse lie than the original lie (such as when the original spot had been in the rough and the dropped ball came to rest in the fairway, or vice versa; or when the ball had been at rest in deep grass and the dropped ball came to rest on top of the grass).

Requiring the player to replace the ball on the estimated spot (including being required to replace the ball on, under or against any fixed or growing things it had been at rest on, under or against) helps to make sure the ball is played from as close as possible to its original spot and from the same or almost the same lie.

Replacing the ball on its estimated spot also applies when the player does not know the exact original spot of a ball that was lifted or moved on the putting green, and so the same procedure applies throughout the course.
